
INTRODUCTION

- The dense forest of the Osun Sacred Grove, on the outskirts of the city of Osogbo, is one of the last remnants of primary high forest in southern Nigeria. Regarded as the abode of the goddess of fertility, Osun one of the pantheon of Yoruba gods. The landscape of the grove and its meandering river is dotted with sanctuaries and shrines, sculptures and art works in honour of Osun and other deities.
- The Osun grove has been described by UNESCO as a tangible expression of Yoruba divinatory and cosmological systems; its annual festival is a living thriving and evolving response to Yoruba beliefs in the bond between people, their ruler and the Osun goddess. In fact, Osun sacred grove became inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage site in 2005. There are two important parties to the development of the Osun Osogbo grove beyond occasional tourism patronage. They are the promoters of culture and the custodians of culture. CBCIU is one of the promoters of black culture in Africa. Hence, the centre has significant role to play in the promotion of Osun Osogbo for tourism patronage.




OSUN RIVER DURING THE NON-FESTIVE DEPIOD
